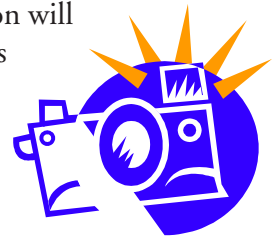
Coaches Corner
